
Billy and his toy





In the end, they stayed at home. They played board games together. John felt sad. What a bad day!




Back to School


Emma is cheerful because she tells us jokes. We all laugh. She is funny. We love her jokes. She is nice too. She takes care of her friends. We love her so much.



Although I burned the cake, mum didn't shout at




